## Curb Appeal



Here are a few key areas to consider when assessing the exterior aesthetic condition of your lot:

- All exterior surfaces of the home are clean (no visible dirt, mold, or mildew.)
- Grass is cut on a regular basis and weed free. Consider hiring a landscape contractor to take the maintenance burden off of your schedule, several advertise regularly in this magazine.
- Properly trim all areas a mower cannot reach, for example along the house foundation, fencing or around the mailbox.
- Flower and landscape beds are maintained in good condition, free of dead vegetation and weeds.
- Landscape beds have clearly defined edges and appropriate mulch or ground cover.
- Hardscape is secured in place, maintained and upright.
- Bushes and shrubs are maintained free of insects and properly pruned.
- Healthy trees are pruned so pedestrians and bicyclists can safely pass on the sidewalks.
- Remove tree stakes and all associated hardware that is no longer necessary for the health and maturity of the tree.

- Newspapers and solicitations are removed on a daily basis and not left to accumulate on the lot or mailboxes.
- All trash containers and recycle bins are STORED out of view.
  - Trash and recycling containers are not to be placed out for pickup earlier than the night prior to pick-up. Mondays are Trash & Yard Waste. Thursdays are Trash & Recycling.
- FOR PET OWNERS: all waste is removed and properly disposed of frequently. This includes the owners' individual lot, neighboring lots and all common areas.
